Building Construction Here we go!

We have been informed that our much anticipated Building Programme will commence next Tuesday with the Site Establishment.

- FAL construction will begin erecting fencing so that they can establish the builders access and construction area within the school.
- As the builder's fencing is erected, playgrounds will be modified to ensure that the children are safe and able to enjoy the activities that they are used to at the same time as be able to move across the site safely.
- Tomorrow's Mothers Day Presentation will mark the last use that we will have of the Big Top from Monday this space will fall within the construction zone.
- The area under the Big Blue will become our gathering space for morning assemblies and will now provide shade area for the students at recess and lunchtime.

During Term 1 we have been preparing for the changes that the building programme will bring about to our playgrounds. Last week an additional mini netball court was painted on the concrete between the 2 halfcourt basketball courts near what we lovingly refer to as the 'village' K-2 Area and Mr Laird and Mr Clarke have been developing a passive garden area for the children to enjoy. When this area is complete it will also include a raised sandpit.

Arrival at school - being on time is important

Parents are reminded of the importance of their children arriving at school on time. All children must be within the school grounds by **<u>8:30am</u>** so that they are ready to join the morning assembly which commences at 8:30am.

A small number of parents are regularly driving into the school, carpark at 8:30am and therefore their children are late for class - this is unsettling for the children .

If you use the Kiss and Drop in the car park in the mornings please:

- drive to the next available car space closest to the top of the Kiss and Drop area - do not stop at the walkway as this holds up traffic and causes a traffic jam in Harrington Rd.
- your child must get out of the car on the footpath side.
- your child must be able to get out of the car by themselves parents do not get out of the car
- your child's bag must be in the car with them no child is to move to the back of the car to get their bags out of the car boot.
- NEVER overtake another car in the Kiss and Drop zone.

My child is learning to read, but it's hard for her. She doesn't want to pick up books at home. How can I help? Make books around the house as appealing as possible. Choose stories that include mostly familiar words. Look for subjects she loves or new topics she

might embrace. Also consider books with short items to read, such as jokes or rhymes. Books with appealing pictures are great, too!

Ask questions to get your child thinking and talking about reading

It is critical that your child read over the summer. Help her reflect on what she reads and improve her

- comprehension by asking a lot of questions! You might ask:
- Who were the main characters? What did you like or dislike about them? Do they remind you of people you know? How?
- What happened in the story? How did it start? What happened in the middle? How did it end? Were you happy with the way the book ended?
- Have you ever experienced
- something that happened to the characters in the story? What would you change about the book if you were the author? What plot would make a good sequel?

INTERNET SAFETY TIPS

As a parent of primary school children, it's crucial to prioritise Internet safety to ensure your child's online experience is positive and secure. Here are some essential tips and information to keep in mind:

- Open Communication: Establish open lines of communication with your child about their online activities, encouraging them to share any concerns or issues they may encounter.
- Education and Awareness: Teach your child about online risks, including cyberbullying, inappropriate content, and stranger danger. Emphasize the importance of responsible behavior and respectful online communication.
- Parental Controls: Utilise parental control features and software to restrict access to age-inappropriate websites and monitor your child's online activities.
- Strong Passwords: Instruct your child on the importance of creating strong, unique passwords and not sharing them with anyone except trusted adults.
- Privacy Protection: Teach your child to safeguard personal information such as their full name, address, school details, and contact numbers. Stress the importance of not sharing such information online.
- Safe Online Friends: Encourage your child to only accept friend requests or interact with individuals they know in real life. Discuss the risks of connecting with strangers online.
