RELIGION



The Annunciation always falls on March 25, exactly nine months before the birth of Jesus Christ at Christmas. However, the celebration of the feast is transferred to a different date if it falls on a Sunday of Lent, during Holy Week, or during the octave of Easter. The Church considers Masses for the Sundays of Lent, any time in Holy Week, and any time from Easter through the Sunday after Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday) to be so important that even this Marian feast cannot replace one of them. So, when the Annunciation falls on a Sunday in Lent (before Palm Sunday), it is transferred to the following Monday. If it falls on Palm Sunday or on any day in Holy Week, it is transferred to Low Monday, the Monday after the Sunday after Easter.

When is the Feast of the Annunciation This Year?

Annunciation 2024: Monday, March 25, 2024 (transferred to Monday, April 8, 2024)

On the Feast of the Annunciation, we celebrate the day that the Angel Gabriel visited the Virgin Mary announcing that she was going to be the mother of Jesus. Even though Mary did not understand completely, she trusted God's plan for her life, and she said yes to becoming the mother of God and our mother.

The words of the "Hail Mary" come from the Angel's greeting: "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you." God's grace lives in each one of us, but Mary was full of grace because she was born without any Original Sin.

We can turn to Mary, our mother, whenever we need help making difficult decisions or if we are scared to say yes to God. She loves us very much, and she is always praying that we will have the courage to listen to and obey her son.

We are celebrating the Feast of the Annunciation on Monday 8th April, 8:30am in the hall, with the new Mini Vinnies members in Year 4 leading our liturgy. We are looking forward to parents and families joining us.

At St Angela's one of our school wide agreements is showing respect

A regular discussion that teachers have with students at school is about the use of respectful language. From time to time students report to teachers that they have heard socially offensive language at the shops, on social media channels, streaming services and in some forms of modern music. At other times students report that they have witnessed other students using language inappropriately or that they have heard disrespectful language such as swearing and put downs in the playgrounds. When this happens teachers point out to the students that this type of language is unacceptable and makes people feel uncomfortable, unsafe, threatened and uneasy.

Parents and carers play a crucial role in being proactive in monitoring what children are viewing or being exposed to online. It is also important to pay attention to what your child is reporting about their play with other children. Discussing the use of words or the origin of some derogatory terms can help prevent inappropriate or disrespectful language filtering into the classroom or the school vard, which in turn helps to build a more tolerant, safe and connected school community.

This week I am including a link to a special report on SchoolTV Respectful Language . The Report offers a number of guidelines to help manage a suitable approach when discussing with your child the importance of respectful language.



At St Angela's we are encouraged to be good problem solvers, ensuring we try to control situations to our best ability while making things work with others. The students have discussed in their classes how to use the S.T.E.P process —a structured approach to problem-solving applicable that the students can use in both the Classroom and on the Playground.



How can you help your child be a Problem Solver at home?

Prompt your child to contribute some suggestions to solve the problem. This phase typically requires significant practice—not only generating ideas but also patiently awaiting their turn, actively listening, and expressing opinions respectfully, even if they differ from your suggestions or those of another child involved. You may have to frequently remind your child that at this moment, we're simply brainstorming ideas, helping them distinguish between generating ideas and finalising the course of action.

You can conclude the conversation with your child by briefly talking them through the process they had gone through and commending them again for coming up with a solution.

Hopefully, this opportunity to own the conflict and resolve it cooperatively will yield impressive dividends as your child builds the skills needed to be an active problem-solver.
