

SPECIAL REPORT

Eating Anxiety



The complexity of eating anxiety stems from a combination of social, psychological, and environmental factors. Young people may develop this anxiety due to social pressures related to eating in front of others, fears about body image, or due to more ingrained issues such as eating disorders. Additionally, cultural norms or dietary restrictions can also play significant roles, as can direct experiences like bullying or teasing related to food choices or eating habits.

Whilst not a formally recognised condition, eating anxiety is a genuine and often overwhelming experience that can significantly hinder a young person's ability to participate in everyday activities comfortably. This condition can lead to serious nutritional deficiencies and social withdrawal, impacting overall health and academic performance.

Recognising and addressing eating anxiety is crucial for parents, carer, and educators. Through education, policy changes, and community support, we can help young people manage their anxieties and improve their relationship with food, thereby enhancing their overall well-being and social interactions.

Feedback Platform for Schools

Research shows that student feedback is one of the most reliable and effective tools for improving outcomes. Our school is dedicated to using student feedback to understand and improve student experiences.

This year we have engaged Pivot, an Australian-based Education Technology resource that will provide teachers with a simple way to gather authentic and timely feedback on wellbeing.

What will the Students do?

Our Students will routinely complete short surveys where questions relate to student wellbeing. Teachers will guide their students through the survey process and will engage students in conversation about the feedback they have received.

Arrival at school on time is important

After the holiday sleep ins and perhaps lazy days with less routine, being back at school can be challenging for our children as they return to the school routine. This week it has been noticeable that some children are struggling to be at school on time.

Arrival at school, particularly being on time, is important and sets your child up for a great day at school. All children must be within the school grounds by 8:30am so that they are ready to join the morning assembly which commences at 8:30am.

Arriving in the Kiss and Drop at 8:30am means that your child will be late for class as this is the bell time. Being late is unsettling for the children and a pattern of regular late arrival of just 10 mins can mean that over a week your child is missing an hour of schooling (by the time they arrive in the classroom). Punctuality is a necessary life skill and habit for children to develop.

Travel or Holidays During the School Term

Applications for Extended Leave Travel - (5 or more days must be completed and then submitted to the office 3 weeks prior to the travel.




















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
