### RELIGION

St Angela's Day - On Friday 13th December we are celebrating the feast day of St Angela Merici, our school patron saint.

- St. Angela Merici, the founder of the Ursuline Order, led a remarkable life filled with devotion, education, and social reform. Here are some significant and interesting facts about her life:
- 1.Born Into a Noble Family, Raised by Her Uncle St. Angela Merici was born in 1474 in Italy. Her parents died when she was young, and she was raised by her uncle, who made sure she got a good education.
- 2. Lived Through Tragedy Early in Life Angela went through a lot of sadness early on. After losing both her parents, her younger sister also died. These tough experiences made her turn to God and helped her grow spiritually.
- **3.** A Vision Inspired Her to Teach When Angela was young, she had a spiritual vision that made her feel called by God to help others, especially to teach young girls. This was the start of her mission in life.
- 4. Cared About Educating Girls Angela was one of the first to really focus on giving girls a good education. She believed that education wasn't just about learning facts, but about helping young women grow in both knowledge and good character.
- 5. The Ursuline Order Started as a Small Group In 1535, Angela founded the Ursuline Order, but it didn't begin as a traditional religious group. It started as a small group of women who wanted to teach and help the poor. Over time, it grew into a well-known religious order.
- 6. Encouraged Women to Live in the World Unlike other religious groups at the time, Angela didn't want women in her group to live in a convent or behind closed doors. She encouraged them to live in the world and serve their communities by teaching and helping others.
- 7. Patron Saint of Teachers Angela is known as the patron saint of teachers, especially those who teach young girls. Her way of teaching, which focused on both the mind and the heart, had a huge impact on education.
- 8. Inspired by St. Ursula Angela named her group the Ursuline Order after St. Ursula, a woman from the 4th century who was also known for helping young women. Angela felt connected to her mission to teach and guide girls.
- 9. Her Legacy Lives On in Schools such as ours Angela's Ursuline Order grew quickly and became one of the most important groups in the world for educating girls. Ursuline schools and charities can be found in many countries today.
- 10. She Was Honored as a Saint Angela was beatified (declared a "blessed") in 1768 and was later made a saint in 1950 by Pope Pius XII. Her feast day is celebrated on January 27th, the day she died in 1540.
- 11. Humility and Service Were Her Core Values Even though Angela became famous for her work, she stayed humble and focused on serving others. She lived a simple life, always putting God and others first.
