STUDENT WORKBOOKS COMING HOME

This week the children will be bringing home their exercise books to share with you. Please take the time to look through, discuss and enjoy the work and responses your child has completed. Please remember that not all work undertaken is recorded in workbooks. In Religion, lessons involve prayer, role plays, research reading, listening to God's word etc., all of which play an important part in the children's learning. You may like to discuss your child's everyday faith experiences.

When looking at Mathematics books remember that mathematical thinking is often recorded in different ways. Children undertake a great deal of mental computation, reasoning and problem solving. They are also often required to articulate their thinking in a group.

You will notice in each of these workbooks, the children have placed a sticky note in their books to indicate a piece of work that they would like to share with you. We encourage you to write a comment about something they have done well. Children really do treasure your comments.

Additionally, we ask that the books be returned promptly the next school day so that your child can continue their written work in the appropriate book.

WELLBEING

As parents and carers, we often feel the need to correct our children's behavior right away, especially when they are acting out, or struggling to follow expectations. However, research highlights the importance of connection before correction, prioritising a strong, trusting relationship with your child before addressing their behavior.

Why Is Connection Before Correction Important?

Builds Emotional Security - When children feel safe, valued, and heard, they are more open to learning and growth.

Reduces Power Struggles – Children are less likely to become defensive or shut down when they feel connected to the person guiding them.

Encourages Emotional Regulation – A connected child can better manage emotions, making them more receptive to problemsolving and behavior change.

Strengthens Communication & Trust – When children feel understood, they are more likely to share their thoughts and feelings, which helps prevent future challenges.

Promotes Long-Term Positive Behavior – Rather than using fear or punishment, connection fosters internal motivation to make good choices.

What Can You Do to Support Your Child

Instead of jumping straight to discipline or consequences, you may wish to try these strategies to connect with your child first:

Pause & Stay Calm – Take a deep breath before reacting. Responding with calmness models emotional regulation for your child.

Acknowledge Their Feelings - Before addressing the behavior, show that you understand their emotions. For example: "I can see that you're really frustrated right now."

Offer Comfort & Reassurance - Let your child know they are safe and loved, even when they make mistakes.

Use Gentle Curiosity Instead of Judgment - Ask open-ended questions to understand what's happening. For example: "Can you help me understand what's making you upset?"

Be Present & Engaged - Sometimes, a hug, a calm voice, or sitting beside them can make all the difference in helping a child feel secure.


Correct with Guidance, Not Punishment - Once your child is calm, guide them toward better choices. Instead of "Stop yelling!", try: "Let's take a deep breath together and talk about what's bothering you."

Encourage Problem-Solving - Help your child think of better ways to handle similar situations in the future. For example: "Next time you feel this way, what can we do instead?"

By prioritising connection before correction, we are not ignoring behaviour, but rather teaching children how to manage emotions, make thoughtful decisions, and feel supported - helping them grow into confident and emotionally resilient individuals.

Compass Parent Portal - St Angela's parents are requested to download the Compass Parent Portal app once your child is enrolled at our school. It is our primary communication tool that will facilitate effective communication between parents and school. All school notes, notices and newsletters will be sent through Compass. To access the Compass Parent Portal app, simply download the 'Compass School Manager' app, available through Apple Store or Google Play. It is suitable for both iPhone and Android Smartphones.



QKR! (pronounced 'quicker') Mobile Payment App - St Angela's is a 'cashless school'. QKR! is an easy to use mobile phone application that is also suitable for both iPhone and Android Smartphones. This service is currently available for all payments except for school fees. Communications will be distributed as new events and products become available for purchase.

CHANGING GOING HOME ARRANGEMENTS

A reminder to parents that our official school day is from 8:30am until 2:50pm and that your child is required to be present between these times. Children should not be taken out of school early unless it is for an important reason (ie. appointment for specialists etc.) Likewise, any changes of going home arrangements should only be made in cases of emergencies. As you can appreciate, contacting classes for children to come to the office for early departures or to advise going home changes is disruptive to the learning, in particular to the whole school if the class is not in their room and an announcement needs to be made.
