Understanding Wellbeing in Children

Wellbeing in children goes beyond just happiness—it includes their social, emotional, and mental health. A child's wellbeing is shaped by their relationships, environment, and ability to manage emotions and challenges.

What Does Wellbeing Look Like?

Children with strong wellbeing often:

- Feel safe, secure, and valued
- Form positive relationships with peers and adults
- Express and manage emotions in a healthy way
- Show resilience in the face of challenges
- Engage in learning with curiosity and confidence

How Can Parents and Carers Support Children's Wellbeing?

Build strong relationships – Children thrive when they feel connected and supported. Spend quality time together and listen to their thoughts and feelings.

Encourage emotional expression – Help your child name and talk about their emotions. Books like 'The Kissing Hand' by Audrey Penn; 'The Invisible String' by Patrice Karst and 'In My Heart - A Book of Feelings' by Jo Witek can help.

Foster a growth mindset – Praise effort rather than results to encourage resilience and confidence.

Promote a healthy routine – Sleep, nutrition, and physical activity play a big role in wellbeing.

Teach coping strategies – Simple breathing exercises, mindfulness, and problem-solving skills can help children manage stress. Supporting a child's wellbeing is a journey, and small, everyday moments make a big difference. Let's work together to help our children grow into happy, resilient individuals!

SAFETY AT THE BACK GATE

Each afternoon teachers supervise students closely at the back gate to ensure that children are collected by parents in a safe way. We need your help and cooperation to keep your child safe.

- Parents are to meet the children on the school side of Orleans Way and no child is permitted to walk across the road to a waiting parent.
- Please NEVER call or wave your child across the road. The most common pedestrian accident for children occurs when a parent is waiting on one side of the road and the child runs across to them taking no notice of the cars travelling along the road in between them. Orleans Way is a public road and it must be treated as such.
- Parents are not to wait on the road itself, you must be on the footpath. As adults we must model road safety to our young children.
- Please move off from the gateway as soon as you have collected your child so that other children can exit the driveway safely to their parents. This is not an area for social catch ups.

Feedback Platform for Schools

Research shows that student feedback is one of the most reliable and effective tools for improving outcomes. Our school is dedicated to using student feedback to understand and improve student experiences. This year we have again engaged Pivot, an Australian-based Education Technology resource that will provide teachers with a simple way to gather authentic and timely feedback on wellbeing.

What will the Students do?

Our Students will routinely complete short surveys where questions relate to student wellbeing. Teachers will guide their students through the survey process and will engage students in conversation about the feedback they have received.

CASH CARDS FOR CANTEEN

Canteen operates for students at second break each Tuesday and Friday (1:20pm). In accordance with CEDP guidelines, our Canteen operates as a cashless service to students. Students are able to purchase a variety of items at the canteen in the price range of 50c -\$2.00 using a school issued CASH CARD that can be purchased by parents on Qkr. Parents can purchase either a \$5 or \$10 CASH CARD. The card will be punched at the canteen each time a student purchases an item according to its cost. 
New Families and Kindergarten BBQ Friday 21st February 5.00pm-7.00pm

COMMUNICATION WITH TEACHERS



St Angela's Primary recognises that email is a fast and convenient way to communicate with your child's teacher. As you would appreciate, teachers read their emails at various times throughout the school day. Further, that other than in the case of a genuine emergency, they are generally not expected to respond to emails from parents and students outside of normal working hours. Please keep in mind that if you send an email to a member of our staff outside of normal working hours, a reply will not be received until the following working day.

If you wish to contact your child's teacher, please continue to direct your emails to the school email account which will then be passed onto the relevant teacher, as per our usual practice.

PARENT VOLUNTEERS

To volunteer at St Angela's parents must complete the <u>Building Child Safe Communities - Volunteer Undertaking</u> and <u>Training Module</u>. Your BCSC status is only valid for 2 years. Volunteers must adhere to the NSW Health COVID Safe guidelines. We thank you for your continued support of the staff and students of St Angela's.



CHANGING GOING HOME ARRANGEMENTS

A reminder to parents that our official school day is from 8:30am until 2:50pm and that your child is required to be present between these times. Children should not be taken out of school early unless it is for an important reason (ie. appointment for specialists etc.) Likewise, any changes of going home arrangements should only be made in cases of emergencies. As you can appreciate, contacting classes for children to come to the office for early departures or to advise going home changes is disruptive to the learning, in particular to the whole school if the class is not in their room and an announcement needs to be made.


